

"In June 2017, we completed two years of surveys of microplastic pollution within the Gallatin Watershed. The project mobilized over 120 local volunteers in collection efforts, and engaged local businesses, NGOs, and policy leaders in an effort to quantify and reduce plastic pollution entering our waters. Preliminary results reveal that nearly half of all samples contain microplastics. " - Katie Holsinger, Microplastics Project Manager
